Job Outlook

Fewer jobs are expected for farmers and ranchers than in the past; better prospects are expected for wage and salary agricultural managers. In contrast, agricultural managers are projected to gain jobs, growing by about 6 percent. Full-time, salaried agricultural managers have median weekly earnings of \$775. The middle half earned between \$570 and \$1,269 per week. The lowest paid 10 percent earned less than \$358, and the highest paid 10 percent earned more than \$1,735 per week.
